





Dear Mr. Nunes:

I am writing as a courtesy to let you know of plans that the Mattapoissett Land Trust along with the Friends of the Mattapoissett Bike Path are developing to hold a bicycle ride fundraising event that will pass through the towns of Mattapoissett, Fairhaven, Acushnet, Freetown, Lakeville, Middleborough, and Rochester on Sunday, May 22, 2016.

The "Tour de Crème", as we're calling it, will consist of three scenic bicycle rides of approximately 12, 25, and 50 miles. We are working with area restaurants and creameries to incorporate them as rest stops where riders will be able to use restrooms, fill water bottles, and enjoy an ice cream. Early response to the concept has been very positive and we hope to attract 50 participants for each distance.


The routes are shown and described in the enclosed documents. They will for the most part use less trafficked roads. The long route will have short stretches on busier roads, but we expect those cyclists to be experienced and ride safely in accordance with traffic rules. We will orient riders with paper maps, a cell phone navigation app, yard signs placed at intersections for the day, and discreet on-road markings similar to those used by local cycling clubs. In addition, we will have volunteers on the route to direct riders at less obvious turns, we will have "ambassador" cyclists guiding participants, and we will have 2 or 3 support vehicles ready to provide assistance to lost or stranded cyclists.

All participants will be required to wear helmets. They will be directed to call 911 in case of any medical emergency. We plan to go forward with the bicycle rides in the event of showers or light rain but will cancel or postpone in the event of heavy rain, dense fog, or other dangerous conditions. We will call local police departments the morning of the event to remind them of the cyclists' presence during the day.

That is the plan as it now stands. I have already presented it to Mattapoisett's Board of Selectmen, Town Administrator, and Chief of Police. As with them, I invite you to share any concerns you may have, conflicts you are aware of, suggestions you can offer for improving public safety, or other ways in which we can cooperate to improve the event. We look forward to a fun day of cycling through Middleborough and surrounding towns and promoting local ice cream stops. Additional details will be available soon at www.tourdecreme.org.

Tour de Crème Ride Descriptions, current as December 2, 2015. Visit TourdeCreme.org for updates.

The 12-mile Tour de Crème goes through Mattapoisett and Fairhaven. Anticipated ride time 1.5 to 2 hours. The route is as follows:

- Start at Mattapoisett Town Beach at 1 pm
- West on Water St. to Main St.
- Cross Route 6 at the Main St. signal, left on Acushnet Rd., left on River Rd. to Route 6
- Left on Route 6 to Mattapoisett Neck Rd. (A police detail will be on hand to calm traffic. Riders to use sidewalk and Chowder House parking lot, cross when clear.)
- Mattapoisett Neck Rd. to Mattapoisett Rail Trail
- Enter Fairhaven on bike path at Shaw Rd.
- Continue on Phoenix Trail to Arsene St., left on the bike path extension through Little Bay Conservation Area
- At end of the bike path, cross Sconticut Neck Rd. at Orchard St. crosswalk
- Follows residential streets to the intersection of Manhattan Ave. and Sconticut Neck Rd.
- Rest stop at Mac's Soda Bar
- Cross Sconticut Neck Rd. and return to bike path via Little Bay Rd.
- Return to Mattapoisett via bike path, Matt. Neck Rd., River Rd., Acushnet Rd., and Main St.
- Finish at Mattapoisett Land Trust's Munro Preserve (near the wharves) between 2:30 and 3 pm.

The 25-mile Tour de Crème goes through the towns of Mattapoisett, Acushnet, and Rochester. Anticipated ride time 1 h 45 m to 3 hours. The route is as follows:

- Start at Mattapoisett Town Beach around noon
- West on Water St. to Main St., cross Route 6 at the Main St. traffic signal
- Left on Acushnet Rd. to the Acushnet border
- Enter Acushnet. Continue west on Mattapoisett Rd., Hathaway Rd., and Wing Rd.
- Right (north) on White St., left on Village Ave., north on Main St.
- First rest stop at **Acushnet Creamery** on Main St.
- Continue north a few blocks on Main St., turn left (west) on Hamlin St.
- Right (north) on Middle Rd., right on Lake St., south on Main St.
- Second rest stop at the **Country Whip**
- Cross Main St. to Rte. 105, Robinson Rd.
- Enter Rochester
- Follow Rte. 105 to Vaughan Hill Rd., turning right on Cushman Rd., left on Rounseville Rd.
- Right (south) on Vaughan Hill Rd., right on New Bedford Rd.
- Third rest stop at **Captain Bonney's**
- Continue west on New Bedford
- Re-enter Acushnet briefly on Perry Hill Rd.
- Left on Gammons Rd., enter Mattapoisett and continue on Long Plain Rd.
- Left on Acushnet Rd., right on Main St.
- Finish at Mattapoisett Land Trust's Munro Preserve (near the wharves) between 1:45 and 3 pm

The 50-mile Tour de Crème goes through Mattapoisett, Fairhaven, Acushnet, Freetown, Lakeville, Middleborough and Rochester. Anticipated ride time 3.25 to 5 hours. The route is as follows:

- Depart Mattapoisett Town Beach at 11 am
- West on Water St. to Main St., cross Rte. 6 at signal
- Left on Acushnet Rd., left on River Rd., right on Fairhaven Rd., left on Mattapoisett Neck. Police detail will be on hand to calm traffic at this intersection.
- Right on Mattapoisett Rail Trail
- Enter Fairhaven at Shaw Rd., continue on Phoenix Trail
- Right on Gелlette Rd., left (west) on Rte. 6, continue one block, right on New Boston Rd.
- Enter Acushnet on New Boston Rd.
- Left on Mattapoisett Rd., straight on Hathaway Rd., straight on Wing Rd.
- Right on White St., left on Village Ave. to Main St., right (north) on Main
- First rest stop at **Acushnet Creamery**
- Continue north on Main, left on Hamlin St. to Middle Rd.
- Right (north) on Middle Rd., right on Leonard St., and left (north) on Main St.
- Second rest stop at the **Country Whip**
- Continue north on Main St., turn left on Lake St., right on Peckham Rd., right on Keene Rd.
- Enter Freetown on Keene Rd.
- Continue on Keene Rd., turn left on Ann Record Ln., left (south) on Rte. 18 / Middleboro Rd.
- Third rest stop at **Annie's Ice Cream Shack**
- North on Rte. 18 / Middleboro Rd. to the Quittacas Water Treatment Facility
- (Optional shortcut: from 18 N, right on Morton Rd., straight on North Ave, right on Neck Rd.)
- Right on Negus Way through facility
- Enter Rochester
- Left (north) on Rte. 105
- Enter Lakeville
- Right on Long Point Rd.
- Enter Middleborough, cross causeway
- Right on Marion Rd.
- Enter Rochester
- Continue on Neck Rd.
- Left on Burgess Ave., right on Stuart Rd., left on Walnut Plain Rd.
- Right on High St.
- Fourth rest stop at **Robin's Nest**
- Backtrack on High St. to Pierce St., left on Pierce to Mary's Pond Rd.
- Left on Mary's Pond Rd. to Plumb Corner, right on 105, quick left on New Bedford Rd.
- Fifty rest stop at **Captain Bonney's**
- Continue west on New Bedford Rd. / Perry Hill Rd.
- Reenter Acushnet briefly on Perry Hill Rd.
- Left on Gammons Rd.
- Reenter Mattapoisett on Gammons Rd., continue on Long Plain Rd.
- Left on Acushnet Rd., right on Main St.
- Finish at Mattapoisett Land Trust's Munro Preserve (near the wharves) between 2:15 and 4 pm.
