RE: Revocation, Establishment, and Merging of Police Promotional Eligible Lists

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Please be advised that on February 18, 2015, the Human Resources Division (HRD) will establish the new eligible lists (Attachment A) resulting from the October 2014, Police Promotional Examination for Police Sergeant, Lieutenant and Captain.

Promotions made through the certification delegation process off of a current eligible list will be valid only if the selected individuals receive the promotion on or before February 17, 2015. Candidates cannot be promoted subsequent to the revocation of an eligible list on which their name appears.

For those Departments where there is not an eligible list scheduled to be merged or established, the Department's existing eligible list will be extended for a period of time until a new eligible list can be established, but not to exceed three years from the first day of the month the exam was held, in accordance with our revocation policy.

In accordance with the certification delegation process, HRD will send the entire eligible list to those Appointing Authorities affected. Please be advised that all promotions made from the new eligible list must be submitted to HRD through the Massachusetts automated Civil Service (MaCS) system. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact your Civil Service Liaison. Thank you.



Dear Mr. Frawley:

On July 24, 2014, you were notified of proposed modified flood hazard determinations (FHDs) affecting the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) and Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report for the Town of Middleborough. The statutory 90-day appeal period that was initiated on August 7, 2014, when the Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) published a notice of proposed FHDs for your community in *The Middleborough Gazette*, has elapsed.

FEMA received no valid requests for changes in the FHDs. Therefore, the determination of the Agency as to the FHDs for your community is considered final. The final FHDs will be published in the *Federal Register* as soon as possible. The modified FHDs and revised map panels, as referenced above, will be effective as of July 16, 2015, and revise the FIRM that was in effect prior to that date. For insurance rating purposes, the community number and new suffix code for the panels being revised are indicated above and on the maps and must be used for all new policies and renewals.

The modifications are pursuant to Section 206 of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-234) and are in accordance with the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended (Title XIII of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, Public Law 90-448), 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 44 CFR Part 65. Because of the modifications to the FIRM and FIS report for your community made by this map revision, certain additional requirements must be met under Section 1361 of the 1968 Act, as amended, within 6 months from the date of this letter. Prior to July 16, 2015, your community is required, as a condition of continued eligibility in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), to adopt or show evidence of adoption of floodplain management regulations that meet the standards of Paragraph 60.3(d) of the NFIP regulations. These standards are the minimum requirements and do not supersede any State or local requirements of a more stringent nature.

It must be emphasized that all the standards specified in Paragraph 60.3(d) of the NFIP regulations must be enacted in a legally enforceable document. This includes the adoption of the effective FIRM and FIS report to which the regulations apply and the modifications made by this map revision. Some of the standards should already have been enacted by your community. Any additional requirements can be met by taking one of the following actions:

1. Amending existing regulations to incorporate any additional requirements of Paragraph 60.3(d);
2. Adopting all the standards of Paragraph 60.3(d) into one new, comprehensive set of regulations; or
3. Showing evidence that regulations have previously been adopted that meet or exceed the minimum requirements of Paragraph 60.3(d).

Communities that fail to enact the necessary floodplain management regulations will be suspended from participation in the NFIP and subject to the prohibitions contained in Section 202(a) of the 1973 Act as amended.

A Consultation Coordination Officer (CCO) has been designated to assist your community with any difficulties you may be encountering in enacting the floodplain management regulations. To assist your community in maintaining the FIRM, we have enclosed a Summary of Map Actions to document previous Letter of Map Change (LOMC) actions (i.e., Letters of Map Amendment (LOMAs), Letters of Map Revision (LOMRs)) that will be superseded when the revised FIRM panels referenced above become effective. Information on LOMCs is presented in the following four categories: (1) LOMCs for which results have been included on the revised FIRM panels; (2) LOMCs for which results could not be shown on the revised FIRM panels because of scale limitations or because the LOMC issued had determined that the lots or structures involved were outside the Special Flood Hazard Area as shown on the FIRM; (3) LOMCs for which results have not been included on the revised FIRM panels because the flood hazard information on which the original determinations were based is being superseded by new flood hazard information; and (4) LOMCs issued for multiple lots or structures where the determination for one or more of the lots or structures cannot be revalidated through an administrative process like the LOMCs in Category 2 above. LOMCs in Category 2 will be revalidated through a single letter that reaffirms the validity of a previously issued LOMC; the letter will be sent to your community shortly before the effective date of the revised FIRM and

will become effective 1 day after the revised FIRM becomes effective. For the LOMCs listed in Category 4, we will review the data previously submitted for the LOMA or LOMR request and issue a new determination for the affected properties after the revised FIRM becomes effective.

The Southeastern Regional Planning and Economic Development District (SRPEDD) has reviewed the referenced document to development of a resort casino to be located in the city of Taunton and offers the following comments:

SRPEDD's previous comment letters dated January 15, 2014 and October 8, 2014 that were submitted to Kevin K. Washburn, Assistant Secretary to the U.S. Department of the Interior - Bureau of Indian Affairs, provided statements for the most important transportation issues in the regional, including insufficient capacity on Route 24 south of Interstate 495. The proponent responded to each SRPEDD comment, although there is no certainty that any commitments for transportation improvements have been or will be made by the proponent.

Although the report has a detailed descriptive list of intersections that might be impacted by the development of a casino, we found no engineering statement or detailed analysis on the impacts to those intersections. The essential part of the analysis should include vehicle queuing, spill back and any other system wide operational analysis information. It seemed that any recommendations offered were speculative in nature.

Specifically, the influenced area within the Stevens Street, Route 140 and Route 24 interchange indicated curb cut spacing is very close and potential traffic demand is very high. Traffic mitigation should be provided to assist readers to understand the critical issues. They are the essential part of the traffic impact study and without documentation, it is difficult for the reviewing agency to complete a thorough evaluation.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this proposal. SRPEDD staff is available to answer any questions or address any concerns raised by these comments.


