Selectman Frawley noted an email received from a resident in which he mentions being unable to leave messages on the DPW telephone line after hours. Selectman Frawley has experienced the same problem and has raised the issue in the past. Town Manager will have it corrected.

Selectman McKinnon requested to put Cable Committee budget in the budget review schedule with the other departments set up over the next couple of months. Chairman agreed. Town Manager recommended having the Committee come in separately to discuss various matters of interest. Chairman requested that it be scheduled in the same timeframe as budget discussion.

NEW BUSINESS

MA Water Pollution Abatement Trust Community Septic Management Program Loan

Chairman read aloud the following vote re Septic Betterment – (MA Water Pollution Abatement Trust Community Septic Management Program Loan). Upon motion by Selectman Spataro and seconded by Selectman Frawley, Board voted unanimously to approve.

Surplus Vehicles

Upon motion by Selectman Spataro and seconded by Selectman McKinnon, Board voted unanimously to declare Health department blue 1996 Chevrolet Cavalier, VIN #1G1JF5240T7142840 and Veterans' department white 1999 Chevrolet Lumina vehicles as surplus.

Civil Service Requisition – One New Police Officer

Police Chief Gates addressed Board to explain request to fill one Police Officer position. Upon motion by Selectman Spataro and seconded by Selectman McKinnon, Board voted unanimously to authorize Chairman to sign Civil Service requisition to fill one Police Officer position. This is not an added position.

2012 Water, Wastewater, Trash Tax Lien report

Upon motion by Selectman Spataro and seconded by Selectman Frawley, Board voted unanimously to approve the 2012 Water, Wastewater, Trash Tax Lien report. Selectman Quelle proposed matter be discussed further regarding collecting these outstanding fees, noting that it could be anticipated that these figures are only going to get worse. Town Manager will review last year's numbers and report back to the Board as to if these figures have grown. He noted that the Treasurer does work with individuals to collect these outstanding taxes. Selectman Spataro suggested that, for a fair comparison, we would need to look back ten years.

HEARINGS, MEETINGS, & LICENSES

Edgeway Mobile Home Park Rent Control matter

Chairman continued Edgeway Mobile Home Park Rent Control matter by noting the status of the agreed upon updates that the Park Operator is making. Town Manager suggested the Board continue to 1/9/12, noting that they have met all target dates. Selectman Quelle gave update. Irrigation of Middleboro is doing work and it began today. Comcast cable work began today. Beyond that, we are waiting another ten days to see if they meet Phase I drainage. Health Officer and Planning Director indicated to Selectman Quelle that they expect the deadline to be met. Chairman recommend that the Board think about what it would like for future update schedule. Selectman Quelle noted that there is still an outstanding question as to who, if anyone,

is manning the office at Edgeway. He asked the Town Manager to look into whether they intend to hire someone or what hours they expect to be open for business for accessibility by the residents. Upon motion by Selectman Frawley and seconded by Selectman McKinnon, Board voted unanimously to continue to 1-9-12 at 7:30 PM.

Meeting Schedule

Selectman Frawley noted holiday meeting schedule break period and proposed an additional meeting night. Board agreed to meet on an as needed basis.

Metro Imports, Inc., d.b.a. Metro Volkswagen

Chairman opened public hearing at 7:35 PM on application by Metro Imports, Inc., d.b.a. Metro Volkswagen for a Class I Automobile Dealership license at 3 Chalet Road by reading aloud public hearing notice. Attorney Mather, representing applicant, addressed Board, and submitted receipts for Abutter notification. He offered that Digital Federal Credit Union is the present owner of the property and that the Credit Union has made the sale contingent upon closing by 12/31/11. Attorney Mather noted outstanding issues that they are addressing with the Conservation Commission. Chairman asked Attorney Mather about outstanding taxes owed on the property. He assured the Board that the taxes have been paid and offered that the Town Treasurer's office can confirm. A representative for the proposed dealership presented layout plans for the dealership site. He offered that very little, if any modifications will be necessary to accommodate this business for this site. Attorney Mather noted that the Board had previously issued a WRPD permit for this site, and that, the site is maxed out in that capacity. He has stressed to his client(s) that they must not add any additional pavement. He offered that only "new" cars will be parked on gravel parking lot as "used" vehicles can sometimes leak. There are 54 parking spaces allotted for customer and employee parking as is allowed by ordinance. They are proposing potentially 200 vehicles in total on the site. Discussion ensued. Applicant Michael A. Grieco, Sr. addressed Board. He's been in business for forty years and takes pride in his businesses. Attorney Mather offered that this will be a first-class dealership with a first-class applicant, not to mention some increased tax revenue and some new jobs. They expect to have approximately 20 employees. Mr. Grieco anticipates that they will probably add more sales staff. Chairman asked to hear any questions from the audience and the Board. Hearing none, Chairman declared hearing closed. Upon motion by Selectman McKinnon and seconded Selectman Spataro, Board voted to approve pending proof of payment of taxes. In response to question by Selectman Spataro, Attorney Mather indicated that they will have 134 vehicles for sale plus 6 inside and 16 used. A total of 156 total vehicles will be included on the license along with the hours of operation as indicated on the application.

Utility Pole 50S on Vernon Street – Public Hearing

At 8:10 PM Chairman continued public hearing from 11/21/11 re Utility Pole 50S on Vernon Street. Applicant will re-apply with a new location. Chairman asked to hear any questions/comments. No comments/questions were heard. Upon motion by Selectman Spataro

and seconded by Selectman McKinnon, Board voted unanimously to close the hearing at the applicant's request.

BILL

Upon motion by Selectman McKinnon and seconded by Selectman Frawley, Board voted unanimously to approve payment of bill to Jones Day from Resort funds in the amount of \$969.00.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Assawompsett Pond

Town Manager noted the attached documentation showing that the Wareham Street Bascule Dam water elevation is having no affect on Assawompsett Pond itself. Town Manager expects that it will be recognized that the Town of Middleborough has done all it can to improve the problem. There is a meeting tomorrow evening in Lakeville. New Bedford and Taunton are willing to adjust their pond levels. It is important to monitor the water elevations for the sake of our Town. Selectman Frawley suggested that if the dam wasn't there, it would be difficult to tell where the river starts and the pond starts. The fish ladder is dry. While the pond is staying at levels that are way too high, the fish ladder is bone dry. There are benchmark elevation levels on Rte. 495. The sediment is blocking the river at Rte. 495. He plans to attend the meeting tomorrow night. Discussion ensued. Chairman recommended we see what information is learned at tomorrow's meeting and discuss it further next Monday. Selectman Spataro asked if a more aggressive approach is recommended. Town Manager responded that he does not think so. Wareham Street is very responsive to what we do at the dam. Once we put more water in, he doesn't think it would take long to recover. Selectman Spataro disagreed and wants to be prepared to address Monday. Selectman Frawley agreed with Selectman Spataro, but since we aren't approaching growth season, he doesn't think we are doing any damage right now with the water levels so low. He thinks we could recover fairly quickly, but should wait until we receive latest information tomorrow night. He would like to discuss further next Monday. Selectman McKinnon offered that he doesn't think it would take long to recharge the area with water. Selectman Spataro suggested getting an estimate from anybody who's working for us such as the DPW Director, Planning Director, and others. If it takes a couple of weeks great, but if it takes us a month, he'd rather make sure we are back in order. We did what we were asked to do for Lakeville.

Soule Farm Lease

We are getting close to the end of the ten-year lease. We are in process and should be receiving proposals by early next year.

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Memo from Health Officer re 88 River Street

Ron High, property owner of 88 River Street, addressed Board to comment. He offered that he notified Jeanne Spalding on 9/13 via voicemail and email, which he also emailed Bob Whalen. Copies of which he asked to hand out. He handed out a timeline of events concerning septic system. Town Manager offered that the issue is they didn't pull required permits through Health department. There is a disagreement as to whether or not they can do what they are currently doing in the area in which they are doing it. Mr. High responded that he gave plans of the landscaping to the Building Commissioner. Town Manager noted that it's beyond landscaping. Mr. High offered that he contacted the Health Officer on Friday asking what they have to do with Sitec to get this cleared up and he is not getting any clear answers. Selectman Frawley noted that there have been a number of past problems with this site. Town Manager offered that Ms. Spalding will give Mr. High direction. Selectman Spataro asked that the Town Manager keep the Board informed.

Town Hall Cupola restoration project

Town Manager will be bringing another change order before the Board next week re Cupola. They discovered a badly rotted beam and it will cost approximately another \$11k. We are going to ask the state to cover additional expense/petition for additional funds. They may call in an exterminator for potential critters.

CORRESPONDENCE

#2 Selectman McKinnon will attend Plymouth County Advisory Board meeting on Thursday evening. He wants ask what steps were taken to get us into this mess and what, if any, protections are in there to avoid this in the future. Town Manager offered that he attended a meeting last week with the Plymouth County Retirement Board and other Town Managers. The Retirement Board got what it wanted and it is happy to leave the schedule at 2030. The state gave them permission last year to go to 2040. No one was asking for an increase. All we asked them to do was to look at a couple of scenarios and they refused. They made assurances just the week before that they would work with us. Town Manager encouraged Selectman McKinnon to bring it up at Thursday's meeting. Upon motion by Selectman Spataro and seconded by Selectman Quelle, Board voted unanimously to authorize Selectman McKinnon to raise the issue and ask the Advisory Board to ask the Retirement Board to reconsider looking at extending the schedule based on getting some factual information on how it will affect cities and towns.

Upon motion by Selectman Frawley and seconded by Selectman Quelle, Board voted by Roll Call to go into Executive Session at 9:01 PM to discuss strategy relative to Collective Bargaining and not to return into Open Session. Roll Call: S. Spataro, Yes; A. Frawley, Yes; S. McKinnon, Yes; B. Quelle, Yes; A. Rullo, Yes. Ended at 10:05 PM.

The above site has been visited since the Health Dept received odor complaint on 10/5/11.

- On 10/6/11, no odor was detected at the street location between the above referenced property and the homes at 85-89 River St. Minimal offensive odor detected directly on site.
- 11/3/11, 10AM, no odor detected.
- 11/29/11. revisited site with Ron High in response to anonymous complaint received 11/22/11. No trash piles observed, compost piles of leaves and cranberries were observed. This was verified with DEP as being acceptable under their compost permit. 3 empty rolloff dumpsters and 30(+/-) tires. The tire dumping is not permitted or approved by the Health Dept. or DEP.

On 12/2/11, Ron High called the Health Dept. to notify us that Ray Quinn had been out to the above site to inspect the septic repair work that was done and is all set and wanted to know if we wanted to come out for an inspection. I advised Mr. High that no septic work that was done on site will be approved due to:

- No permit was issued by the Health Dept. for this work.

- **We have no information as to who the installer was or if he was currently licensed as an installer to work in the town.**

Mr. High indicated he had a permit from the Building Clerk. There is no record of what he is referring to. Mr. High's engineer called and I indicated the same to him and inquired as to why he had not ensured his client complied with the process and he indicated he just received a call to come out and inspect.

12/5/11, Vernon Ferreira came into the office today to obtain an installer's permit for the above septic work. He was denied and advised that a permit was required before the work was done. Further investigation in our files indicate a previous problem with Mr. Ferreira's work in which he was advised that he would not be permitted to work in this town again unless he went before the Board to seek approval.

Issues to date that I am aware of include:

- **It is my understanding that Mr. High is actively promoting food composting contracts in various communities for this site which is not permitted for this use.**
- **There is still the outstanding Zoning issue that has not been filed with the ZBA or resolved with the town.**
- **Septic work without permits.**
- **Solid waste violation with a stockpile of tires. (adding to the already high risk levels of mosquito breeding areas.)**

These issues continue to compound with Mr. High. The Building Dept and Health Dept. request that these issues be referred to town counsel.

Timeline of events concerning design and repair of existing septic system


1. 1/2010: Began working with Sitec Engineering and Middleboro Board of Health to test existing system and design approved plans for necessary repairs
2. 11/2010: Middleboro Board of Health approves septic plans submitted by Sitec Engineering on behalf of A-Plus Waste & Recycling Services
3. 11/2011: Ron High, owner of A-Plus Waste & Recycling Services, applies for changes in building permits and notifies Robert Whalen that we are going to be doing the septic system repairs based on the approved plans.
4. 11/28/2011: Under the approved plans and working with KV construction work begins on the septic system
5. 11/30/2011: Sitec Engineering goes to 88 River Street to inspect work and take all necessary elevations and collect other data. At this time it is noted that a minor modification to the inlet and outlet pipe on the septic tank is necessary.
6. 12/1/2011: Both modifications are made
7. 12/2/2011: Sitec Engineering comes back on site to re-inspect the work and notes that all changes are complete.
8. 12/2/2011: Ron High calls Board of Health to ask if they would like to come to the site for an inspection of the work before backfilling. At this time Ms. Spalding notifies Mr. High that no permit was pulled for the work. Mr. High thought that the approved septic plans and the signature of Ms. Spalding of the work permit that he had seen at the town hall a month earlier was all that was necessary. He informs Ms. Spalding that he will contact Sitec and that they will be in touch with Middleboro Board of Health to clear up the confusion.
9. 12/2/2011: Ray Quinn, Sitec Engineering, contacts Ms. Spalding to address the above issues and to see what is necessary to rectify the oversight.
10. 12/5/2011: KV Construction, a licenses septic installation company in Plymouth and Carver, goes to Middleboro Board of Health to file all necessary paperwork and to pull the required permit for the repairs to 88 River Street. Application is denied immediately by the Board of Health.
11. 12/5/2011: Ray Quinn contacts Ms. Spalding to discuss what is necessary to resolve the above mentioned confusion – no clear direction was given to Sitec Engineering.

The data indicates that in spite of lowering the dam at Wareham Street, Lake Assawompsett has continued to rise during October and November.

Mimi Duphily addressed Board to give report on last weekend's holiday events & activities. She acknowledged and thanked the many various individuals and groups for their contributions. She hopes this is just the beginning of a new tradition in Town. Upon motion by Selectman Spataro and seconded by Selectman McKinnon, Board voted unanimously to approve the creation of a Middleborough Beautification Activities account, where money may be donated toward the beautification of the Town. Chairman thanked Mrs. Duphily for all that she did in

organizing the holiday events & activities, noting that it took a lot of hard work. She encouraged everyone to look around downtown and see how nice it looks with the decorations.

Wareham Street dam

DPW Director A. Bagas addressed Board to give update re Wareham Street dam. This dam has no effect on the lowering of the lake in Lakeville. He is monitoring it 3x's per week and if it shows signs of lowering, he will have to raise the dam. We will have to raise it in the spring for the herring. Upon motion by Selectman Spataro and seconded by Selectman McKinnon, Board voted unanimously to have the DPW Director raise the dam if the water level goes any lower at the Wareham Street well. Selectman Frawley noted that he has kept in touch with Representative Orrall and she's staying on top of this issue the best she can. He thinks we should discuss once per month until the herring run. A. Bagas explained that it has to be raised slowly. Selectman McKinnon suggested we need to take action such as taking a couple of bucketful's of sledge out. A. Bagas offered that he doesn't have the proper means to do that. Adam Bond suggested that maybe someone should contact the insurance companies of the homeowners in Lakeville as they stand to lose money and see if they might want to help towards resolving the problem.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Edgeway Mobile Home Park

Ten of the twelve potential new installations of gutters/downspouts have been completed. The contractor is currently trying the gutters into the infiltration chambers re Roof Drain Infiltration Chambers (28 of the 52 units have been connected). Lower to Asphalt Grade has been completed 100% re Catch Basins. The Liners are currently 72% complete (28 out of 39 houses have had installed). Edgeway residents submitted questions for consideration, such as:

1. Who will install heavy duty wire strainers at down spouts?
2. Who will inspect & clean gutters?
3. Who is responsible for removal of debris left on the ground from work?
4. Who will re-grade areas that have been dug up?

Town Manager reported that he hasn't received an answer re who's manning the office at Edgeway yet. Selectman Quelle suggested that the Town Manager can get us answers to ongoing maintenance issues. He thinks residents would like something in writing as to how and when certain things will be cleaned up and taken care of. If tenants can give us a week to get the answers, it would be appreciated. Louisa Brown addressed Board to note that most of the people who are there had their own gutters installed in their homes and that's why they have a question as to how they are going to check them.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Washburn Mill and Freight House

Town Manager and Board discussed disposition of this property. Town Manager will look into whether the cost of taking it down would offset salvaging the wood. Selectman Frawley offered that the cost of taking it down should offset the salvage. Selectman Spataro suggested that our

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Building Commission could probably give us some guidance on that. Town Manager will draw on their expertise and report back next week

Liens & Collections

We are collecting 99% of these liens. Treasurer/Collector asked Town Manager to tell the Board not to worry because we have tools in place to collect these liens and we are.

CORRESPONDENCE

Chairman Rullo shared that he had met with Middleborough Youth Advocates last week. They received a grant to be used to reduce use of tobacco by youths. They are putting together their program and would like to come before the Board in February to present the program and ask for the Board's support.

Chairman also noted that the Town Manager's and Board's secretary's reviews are coming up.

#1 - Selectman McKinnon noted the Permanent Cable Committee's response – They haven't approved any rules & regulations yet. We need to discuss that at some point.

Selectman McKinnon attended the Plymouth County Advisory Board meeting last Thursday night and tried to make a case re funding for pension liability. He tried to explain the impact on the Town and tried to get them to extend for 1 or 2 years. He found out they have no control of Plymouth County Retirement Board. Treasurer informed him that for every year we extend out, it grows by \$88 million. Selectman Spataro suggested we solicit surrounding towns to send letter to Plymouth County Retirement Board. Selectman McKinnon responded that they already voted this year so there is nothing we can do about it. Selectman McKinnon suggested that the only thing we can do is get a 2% discount by paying our full assessment by July. Town Manager noted that we already do that. Selectman Quelle asked if the Retirement Board ever come before Town Boards to be informational. Town Manager responded that he's sure that it could. Town Manager offered that some Town Managers began talks about possibly forming our own retirement system. Maybe we need to look at other options and let them know we are exploring other options.

Upon motion by Selectman McKinnon and seconded by Selectman Spataro, Board voted unanimously to adjourn at 9 PM.
