Students' artwork graces covers for town reports

Middle-high school junior, senior judged to have best entries by selectmen

WEST BRIDGEWATER – The work of two West Bridgewater Middle-High School students will grace town report covers for this June's annual town meeting.

Senior Hayley Sylvester and junior Shannon Deming used pencil and acrylic paint, respectively, to create the winning illustrations in a town-sponsored contest open to all high school students.

"We had to draw pictures about the town, and the theme this year was agriculture, and we have a lot of barns and orchards in West Bridgewater," said Sylvester, 17, whose illustration was selected for the annual town report cover.

"I wasn't expecting to win and I really was excited," said Sylvester.

Sylvester plans to study business at UMass-Dartmouth in the fall.

"I worked a long time on my painting and it feels good to be chosen," said Deming, 16, whose artwork will be displayed on the cover of the Finance Committee's recommendations booklet.

"What I want to do is do an independent study in art and focus on acrylic painting," said Deming. "Art is one of my passions and I want to be a pastry chef because I'm so involved in art and it's more creative because you can express art on cakes and sculpting with food," she added.

The Board of Selectmen judged the contest and selected the winners whose work best represented the rural character and charm of the small-town community.

"I am very pleased to see this recognition go to these two students who always have such pride in their artwork" said Katie Baird, an art teacher at West Bridgewater Middle-Senior High School.
