

We are seeking approval to ride through the City of Middleboro for our Bike MS: Ride the Rhode event this year. Bike MS is a 150-mile charity bike ride – not a race – that winds through Rhode Island and Massachusetts on Saturday and Sunday, June 22-23, 2013. This is our 26th year riding through the local area, and we anticipate over 1000 cyclists participating. Last year we raised over \$870,000!

Our confirmed start/finish location is at the Hasbro Toys parking lot in Pawtucket, RI. After leaving Hasbro on Saturday morning, June 22nd, we will travel 86 miles to our overnight accommodations at Wheaton College in Norton, MA. We will depart from Wheaton on Sunday morning, June 23rd, and return 63 miles to Hasbro for our finish line celebration.

We ride through many towns in the area and as you can see from the attached portion of the route, we are in Middleboro for 3.6 miles on Saturday June 22nd. I would appreciate your assistance in gaining the necessary permission, if any, for the event. In addition, I have the form from Mass Highway which I need signed by a town official and the fire and police representatives. I usually work with the Town Clerk in each town we ride through in this same manner, so hopefully this sounds all right to you too. If you could return the signed form to us at MS Society, 205 Hallene Rd, Suite 209 in Warwick, RI 02886, I would greatly appreciate it, or if you would prefer, I would be happy to pick it up. Unfortunately, the form must be an original so we can't accept a faxed copy.

The local Fire Department must be notified of the detour to ensure that measures will be taken to minimize disruption to the Fire Department's emergency service during the event. Dear Justin,

On behalf of the Middleborough Health Department and Animal Control Department, we extend our sincere appreciation for choosing the Animal Shelter for your Eagle Project. The extensive repairs you and your work teams completed, has made the shelter a safer and cleaner environment for the animals for years to come.

The Middleborough Dog Shelter was built in the fall of 1975 for approximately \$15,000. Its stated function was the "temporary sheltering of loose and stray dogs". Shortly after its completion, Officer William Wyatt took helm of the Dog Division of the Police Department in 1976 and retained that position for over 30 years with one major renovation in 1976 which added roofing to the outside dog runs. His successor, Officer Jayson Tracy, managed the shelter until 2013. During this time the roof on the main building had been graciously replaced during a community service initiative. The facility has deteriorated greatly in this time.

A low budget, a large population of people and pets and limited staff coverage to meet our community needs makes capitol repair tasks difficult to meet. Community service projects and donations are cherished to help maintain a safe clean environment for the animals under Middleborough Animal Control's care.


In 2012, you chose the Middleborough Dog Shelter for your community service project to obtain your Eagle Rank. Since that time, you and various Eagle Scout members and leaders have collaborated in clean up and repair efforts at the shelter. These clean-up and repair efforts included general clean-up of the outside area of the shelter; power washing the dogs runs then painting the walls; replacing the outside kennel run roofs and the associated deteriorated framework; replacing the roof off the small addition in the back of the shelter and masonry work to the kennel runs. Throughout this process, you were often accompanied by the supportive and dedicated efforts of your mother who too helped in the cleanup efforts, painting the kennels and planting flowers in the front section of the shelter.

Our many thanks and sincere respect to you for taking on such a large project and spending long hours and weekends at the shelter. Your dedication leads as an example that self-sacrifice and commitment can make a positive impact and a large difference in the community, in the lives of the people and for the pets and animals as well.
