NEW: Town meeting voters OK Town Hall; all article win easily*More details to come in Thursday's Reporter***By Bera Dunau**

After years of discussion and debate, Foxboro is officially going to have a new town hall.

Article 8, which authorizes the town to borrow \$6.86 million for the construction of a new town hall and the demolition of Foxboro's current one, was approved overwhelmingly at Foxboro's Feb. 23 special town meeting. The vote was 201 for to 12, well above the two-thirds majority required for it to pass. The passing of the article was met with spontaneous applause.

"(I'm) very pleased that we can now move on to actually doing the real work," said Bill Yukna, chairman of the towns permanent municipal and school building committee.

Yukna, who spoke in favor of the project on the floor of town meeting, said that the first serious meeting on the town hall issue was held five years ago.

The new town hall is set to be constructed in the parking lot of Foxboro's current one, and the current building will not be demolished until the construction of the new building has been completed. Foxboro Town Manager Bill Keegan has said that construction could begin as early as April or May, and will take 14 to 16 months.

"We're very very excited that we ... have a new beginning for the ... town hall," said Keegan, after Article 8 passed. "We won't let the community down."

Article 8 was the last article voted on at the briskly-run special town meeting, which drew in 249 participants. All seven other articles passed with similarly overwhelming margins.

Among these was Article 1, a home rule petition that seeks to expand the definition of a mandatory reporter for child abuse and neglect in Foxboro and specify the training that mandatory reporters in the community receive. It passed by a vote of 218-2.

The town will petition the state legislature for two new liquor license for the Forbes Plaza project that will replace Foxfield Plaza, and will appropriate money for a new water main. The position of police chief will be taken out of civil service after the closest vote of the night, 199-15.

In addition, contracts were approved for the new union at town hall, the police department and Boyden Library workers.

FOLLOWING IS THE STORY ON TOWN HALL FROM LAST THURSDAY'S FOXBORO REPORTER:

After years of talk, Foxboro may finally get a new town hall, at least if Article 8 is passed at next Tuesday's special town meeting.

And the prospects for passage brightened considerably when the bids for the project came in well below

the estimated cost.

Bill Yukna, the business administrator for Foxboro's schools and chair of the town's permanent municipal and school building committee, noted that discussions on what to do about Foxboro's town hall have been ongoing for about a decade.

Now, all bids have been opened and the latest project is slated to be more than \$900,000 below estimate, bringing the total cost of the project to \$7,418,518.

Yukna said that the bids for the subcontractors came in at about \$250,000 below estimate in January of this year. Even more savings were realized when the general contractor bids were opened on Jan. 11.

"We had 13 bids in all," said Foxboro Town Manager Bill Keegan, noting that normally the town would expect to get five or six bids for a project like this.

"It's the highest number of general contract bids we'd ever had on a single project," said Yukna.

In December of 2015, an estimation for the total cost of the town hall project was given at \$8,338,553, although Yukna said that he had worried about even meeting that.

"We got lucky," said Yukna.

Yukna and Keegan attributed the lower price to a slowing down of the global economy, particularly in China, which Keegan said has reduced the price of building materials. They both also noted that many of the other bids were competitive as well. Indeed, Yukna said that eight of the 13 bids would have brought the total cost of the project below the mark estimated.

"There were probably a half a dozen that were \$300,000 to 400,000 higher (than the low bid)," said Keegan.

The total project cost includes the \$557,535 already allocated for the design, so Article 8, which would fund the construction of the new town hall, is requesting about \$6,861,000. This will also include the cost of demolishing the old town hall.

The final cost is still more than the \$7.2 million estimated by the permanent municipal and school building committee in 2014, a number that was signed off on by the special town meeting that approved funding to draw up plans for the building.

However, Yukna said that this estimate was made based off square footage, before actual building plans were drawn up. The actual design added about 1,000 square feet to the planned building, which Yukna said was in a large part due to the planning of wider corridors and thicker walls, the thicker walls being mandated by building code requirements.

In total, the new town hall building would be about 16,500 square feet. Should Article 8 pass, Keegan said that construction on it could begin as soon as April or May. Indeed, he said that was the reason a special town meeting was called for February.

"They'd be able to hit construction season right in early spring," said Keegan. "This way we can almost hit the ground running."

Dick Heydecker, who served on the Town Hall Working Group and is a former member of the permanent municipal and school building committee, said that he believes that a better way could have been found to bring Foxboro a new town hall, asserting that the current town hall could be renovate for \$5 million. However, he did acknowledge that the low bids were a positive development.

"The bids that came in were excellent," he said.

However, he asserted that the low bidder will still have to increase his profits, and posited that the project would end up costing more money.

"If they're selling a \$7.4 million package it's actually over \$8 million," said Heydecker.

He said that while he thinks that approving the project is reasonable, he will probably not be voting for it.

"It could have been done cheaper and better," he said.

For their part, Keegan and Yukna expressed hope that Article 8 would pass.

"We know it's not going to get cheaper," said Yukna

"We hope that the community receives it well," Keegan said. "A lot of people like the new design."

He said that construction would take 14 to 16 months and that town employees will continue to work from the old town hall until the new one is constructed. Only once the new town hall has been completed will the old one be demolished.

Keegan acknowledged that parking will be an issue during construction, and said that moving employee parking offsite was being looked into.

"I think that it's a project that the town will be happy that they built once it's approved," said Yukna.

He also asserted that the town has been extremely frugal with its building costs in recent years, noting the Ahern Middle School addition and renovation, the Boyden Library renovation and expansion, the new public safety building and the Foxboro High School renovation.

"We have spent less money on those projects than most communities spend on a single school," said Yukna.






